Cambridge Secondary 1

Grade 7 & 8

- Cambridge Secondary 1 is typically for learners aged 11 to 14 years.
- It builds on the foundations of Cambridge Primary, although it is not essential to have completed that stage before beginning Cambridge Secondary 1.
- It sets clear learning objectives for the first three years of secondary education.
- It is compatible with other curricula, internationally relevant and sensitive to different needs and cultures.
- It is appropriate for learners whose first language is not English.
- It focuses on learners' development and provides schools with international benchmarks.

IGCSE

International General Certificate of Secondary Education

- Cambridge IGCSE is recognised by leading universities and employers worldwide. It is an international passport to progression and success.
- IGCSE students must pass at least 5 subjects (including English and Mathematics) at A* C in order to progress to Cambridge International AS & A Levels.
- Students do not have to write IGCSE external examinations if they choose to continue with AS level as long as they have a minimum of a C symbol in their internal examination at the end of year 2 of their IGCSEs.
- For all external examinations, fees have to be paid per subject. This is not included in the school fees and subjected to the exchange rate with the British Pound.

AS Levels

Advanced Subsidiary

- AS level is a two year programme of study which develops students' knowledge, understanding and skills in independent thinking and applying knowledge.
- At PSS, a students can take up to 6 AS subjects.
- o Students choosing the AS route must pass a minimum of 4 Cambridge International AS examinations in order to graduate with University exemption 4 AS subjects are also the minimum requirement for SA Universities.
- Most European Universities will still require a Foundation year.

A Level

Advanced

- A-level study is demanding.
 The examinations are conducted by Cambridge and are recognized by universities worldwide, without the need for a Foundation year.
- In order to progress to A
 Levels, students must pass
 the AS exam in the subject
 with a minimum C symbol.
- During the study, students will have continuous assessment in school, as well as semester examinations in August. This internal assessment will track students' progress and the grades will be included in the school reports.
- The internal grades do not count towards the final Cambridge examinations.

What is Moodle?



- Moodle stands for Modular Object-Oriented Dynamic Learning Environment.
- It is secure and user-friendly.
- It is used by most of South Africa's leading Universities.
- Moodle offers an engaging and effective eLearning experience.
- The Moodle Mobile app makes it even easier to access courses and content anywhere, anytime, and even when offline.

 With PSSonline we use the Moodle platform and combine it with experienced teachers in International Cambridge subjects to reach out to the rest of our country.



PSSonline: Teachers & Tutors



When you enrol for our online courses you will receive the following:

- Experienced subject teachers
- Weekly group Zoom sessions
 2 x 1 hour scheduled hours per subject per week.
- Assistance, guidance and explanation of subject content
 - Students receive a timetable for meetings, which mostly happen during the morning.
 - Flipped classroom students expected to read and revise the work before class starts.
 Zoom sessions used to explain the work and answer questions.
- Student tutors can assist with one-on-one sessions.
 - At PSS, senior students are rewarded with community service hours if they offer their assistance in the lower grades.
 - These academically strong students work together with the subject teachers to help individuals or small groups in need of extra tutoring.





PSSonline: Examinations



- The online programme aims to complete each student's schooling at the same pace as those at the school. In other words, the year and term planning are the same.
 - All work is available on Moodle.
 - Students download and upload all assignments on Moodle.
 - Students write examinations at the same time as the students of the PSS.
- Our online students write examinations and receive progress reports in the same way as the students at school.
 - Examination papers are emailed to an Examination Officer at the remote venue.
 - Examinations are to be written under supervision with the same rules and regulations as at PSS.
 - After the exams, papers are sealed and couriered back to PSS for marking.
 - Students receive PSS reports in accordance with Cambridge standards.
- Online students have the opportunity to finish the International Cambridge courses and to write the external examinations at the PSS.

PSSonline: Visiting weeks



- Our online students are invited to visit the PSS for the 1st week of the year to meet their teachers and other students. During this week they will learn to use Moodle and to set goals for themselves.
- o Grade 8 students are welcome to join our Orientation Programme for the 1st two weeks.
- Online students may also join the classes for the Open Air Programme (Grade 8 & 9).
- Online students may also join the PSS at the end of Term 1 and Term 2 for face-to-face teaching and to use the lab for practical lessons in the sciences.
- During the weeks in Swakopmund, online students have the opportunity to meet with the rest of their group and their peers at school. Whenever possible, the PSS SRC will organise functions and events to socialise.
- If online students would like to attend more hours for face-to-face teaching at school, they are most welcome but normal school fees will be charged.
- Online students may change to face-to-face teaching at PSS any time, providing that there is space available in the grade.



Eco-School




- The Eco-committee is run predominantly by PSS students.
